## 2024-2025 Accomplishments:

- Established the Civic Hub Initiative, a six-month pop-up designed to deepen civic
  engagement by spotlighting critical local issues through rotating displays and
  programming.
- Introduced 3 new services to provide patrons with 5,700 digital magazines available for checkout without any holds or limits, digital access to collections of comics, manga, and picture books, and an online cooking platform with live chef demonstrations for a variety of ages.
- Provided the Comida Food Pantry with harvests from the hydroponic tower garden in partnership with the Association of Religious Communities.
- Collected and delivered over 25 boxes of non-perishable goods to donate to the Daily Bread Food Pantry as part of a campaign to waive overdue fines.
- Developed the 2025-2030 strategic plan for the library based on community feedback.

- Hosted the 3rd Annual Community Baby Shower, a free event for pregnant people and families with small children to meet community organizations dedicated to their well-being and future success.
- Showed a series of famous movies with scenes set in Danbury in partnership with the Danbury Cultural Commission.
- Museum visits
- Received the 2024 Skillbuilders grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services to develop an enrichment program for children entering grades 1-3.
- Received 2025 RUSA Stephen T. Riedner Grant for Life Enhancing Library Programs for People Living with Dementia.
- Featured on the Agewell Across Connecticut tour for being a CTLAB Hub. The library
  was recognized as a top local effort providing inclusivity and accessibility for aging
  residents, people with disabilities, and those with dementia.
